Dear Sir/Madam,

I am writing to express my profound concern and disappointment regarding the drastic deterioration of the living environment in Old Town, particularly concerning the increased air traffic over our residential area. As a resident of Old Town for the past fifteen years, I have witnessed a fundamental shift that has significantly eroded our quality of life.

My family and I deliberately chose to settle in Old Town precisely because of its proximity to a small, private airport. For over a decade, we cherished the tranquil presence of light aircraft and even enjoyed the community aspect of visiting the airport cafe, observing the gentle comings and goings of these smaller planes. It was a charming and peaceful backdrop to our daily lives.

However, in recent times, there has been a drastic and unwelcome change. We are now subjected to the incessant overflights of large jets and substantial propeller planes, which utilize flight paths directly over our homes. This transformation has utterly shattered the serenity and peacefulness that once defined our neighborhood.

The impact on our family's quality of life is pervasive and severe. Our carefully cultivated private backyard, which we invested considerable effort and resources into making an inviting space for family gatherings, barbecues, and entertaining guests, has become virtually unusable. The deafening roar of these large aircraft makes outdoor conversations impossible, forcing interruptions and rendering any attempt at relaxation futile. Weekends and evenings, once dedicated to peaceful enjoyment, are now dominated by disruptive and overwhelming noise pollution.

Furthermore, beyond the auditory assault, we've observed a noticeable increase in particulate matter and grime. Our outdoor furniture, particularly our patio table, requires constant cleaning, never staying pristine for long after being wiped down. This unwelcome change suggests a direct correlation with the emissions from these larger aircraft.

The cumulative impact extends indoors as well: our conversations are continually fragmented, our sleep patterns are severely disturbed by late-night and early-morning flights, and the general cleanliness of our property is compromised. The fundamental sense of peace and community that drew us to Old Town has been irrevocably shattered, replaced by an environment of ceaseless noise and diminished enjoyment.

We appeal to you to acknowledge the significant detriment these changes have caused to the long-term residents of Old Town who chose this community for its once-idyllic environment. We urge you to re-evaluate the decisions that have led to this drastic transformation and to consider measures that could mitigate the severe impact on our homes and our lives.
